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FOREWORD

This book is a companion-volume to the earlier publication entitled **Hymns from Guru Granth Sahib**.

The seventy hymns selected have been thoughtfully arranged under different sections—on God, the Holy Name, False Religion, Transitory World, Universal Brotherhood, the Khalsa, Yoga, Supplication and about Himself. The compositions on God cover both His positive and negative aspects. Hypocrisy and ritual are exposed under the heading of False Religion. The hymns on the Transitory World and the Holy Name respectively show the contrast between the ephemeral and the permanent. The hymns on Universal Brotherhood emphasise the egalitarian aspects of the Guru's philosophy. The hymns on Yoga show how the Guru's Sahaj-Yoga differs from the traditional Yoga. The hymns on the Khalsa sum up the characteristics of the ideal man and the Guru's appreciation of His devotees. The last section containing extracts from Bachitra Natak and Zafar-Namah — both autobiographical hymns throw light on the Guru's mission and his willingness to pay any price for the vindication of Truth, Freedom and Justice.

The editor has covered all the aspects of the Tenth Guru's personality and teaching. Some of the hymns in this collection are quite popular and are sung in Sikh institutions and congregations.

These hymns throw light mainly on the two aspects of the Guru's character. He was not only a Prophet but also a saint-warrior. Though his heart was full of the milk of human kindness, he wielded the sword fearlessly to uproot the tyrant and the wicked. He firmly believed that there is a moral order in the universe, where Good must prevail over Evil in the end.

I feel confident that the book will be a source of great enlightenment and edification to the readers. It meets a long-felt need and will be welcomed by the English-knowing people.

PREFACE TO THE REVISED EDITION

HYMNS FROM THE DASAM GRANTH contains seventy hymns of the tenth Guru. Each hymn is reproduced in the original Punjabi text and underneath is the transliteration in Roman-English, for the benefit of those who cannot read Punjabi. On the opposite page is the English translation, line by line. In the foot-note, I have given annotations on difficult words and concepts.

The Dasam Granth edition in the Punjabi script available in the market, contains 1428 pages. The compositions are in Brij Bhasha, Hindi, Punjabi and Persian languages, and are printed in the following order.

Jaap, Akal Ustat, Bachitra Natak, Chandi Charitar I & II, Chandi Ki Var, Gian Prabodh, Chaubis Avtar, Shabad Hazare, Savaiye, Khalsa Mehma, Shastra Nam Mala, Triya Charitra, Zafar Namah and Hikayat.

The Dasam Granth was compiled by Bhai Mani Singh on the instructions of Guru Gobind Singh's widow – Mata Sundri in 1711. Scholars have not agreed that all the compositions of the Dasam Granth are from the pen of the Tenth Guru. However, the Sikh Panth has accepted the entire Dasam Granth as the work of Guru Gobind Singh.

The present work has been arranged under various headings: God, Holy Name, False Religion, Transitory World, Universal Brotherhood, the Khalsa, Yoga and Autobiographical. Suitable hymns have been presented to throw light on the above themes. The Tenth Guru exposed the hollowness and futility of ritual, Yogic penance and hypocrisy. On the other hand, he valued the Brotherhood of man, Meditation on the Holy Name, Sacrifice for the preservation of Truth and Justice, and living according to the ideal of the Khalsa. His values have stood the test of time and provide a basis for the progressive survival of mankind.

An introduction to the Dasam Granth has been added. The author acknowledges his debt to the translations of Dr. Gopal Singh, Bhai Jodha Singh and annotations of Bhai Randhir Singh.

INTRODUCTION TO THE DASAM GRANTH

The Dasam Granth is the second Holy Book of the Sikhs. There are three versions of the work, namely: Bhai Mani Singh's Bir, Patna Sahib Bir and Sangrur Bir. Giani Kartar Singh has mentioned nine lithographic and printed editions. The most acceptable edition is the Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji Dasam Patshahi, published by Munshi Gulab Singh & Sons, Lahore, in Sambat Guru Nanak 444 (1913 A.D). This edition has 1399 pages of 19 lines each. The popular printed edition available today has 1428 pages. The total number of verses is 17,155.

Its Contents

Jap Sahib: This contains 199 verses which praise the attributes of God. More than 900 names have been used for the Lord; some are positive, others are negative. For example, the first quotation contains both positive and negative aspects of God, while the second contains only negative ones:

- (i) "I salute that God who is Unborn: I salute that Lord who is most Beautiful," (21)
- (ii) Formless, Peerless, Beginningless, Birthless, Bodyless, Colourless, Desireless, Dauntless." (30)

Akal Ustat: This is one of the finest works of the Tenth Guru. The title "Akal Ustat" means "Praise of the Immortal Lord." Here, the Guru uses new names for God like Sarabloh (All-steel), Sarab-kal (All-death), Kharag-ketu (with a banner decorated by the imprint of the sword). This God is the embodiment of fearlessness and courage. The Guru rejects the idea of any chosen people, that is any group being favoured by the Lord – the Jews, the Muslims, the Christians. The Akal Ustat includes Ten Swayyas found in the Nitnem. The Guru rejected idol-worship and also the traditional marks of symbols of holiness. He emphasised repeatedly the brotherhood of man and the need for serving our fellowmen.

Bachitra Natak: The title means 'The wonderful drama', it is a 'Drama of Life'. It includes details of the Guru's life and wonderful performances of legendary deities and popular heroes. The Guru begins the work with an invocation to "The Sword"— one of his Symbols for God.

Chandi Charitra: This details of battles of Chandi with various

demons. Apart from the standard version of Chandi in Bachitra Natak which is based on Bhagwat Puran, there are two other versions in Hindi, based on Markande Puran.

Chandi-di-var: Also called Var Sri Bhagauti Ji Ki is in Punjabi and contains 55 verses. It is regarded as the first Var of its kind in Punjabi.

Gian Prabodh: This contains stories from the Mahabharata and also some pithy sayings and aphorisms. It is a book of practical wisdom, explaining the essence of Raj-Dharam (political morality), Dan-Dharam (the principles of charity), Bhog-Dharam (the principles of family-life), and Moksh-Dharam (the code for salvation).

Chaubis Avtar: Though technically a part of Bachitra Natak, it is also treated as an independent composition. Here are given the 24 incarnations of the Hindu god Vishnu. There is also a supplement called *Mehdi-Mir-Badh*, which gives an account of the Saviours who came to uphold truth and justice.

Brahma Avtar: Like Chaubis Avtar, but dealing with the seven incarnations of Brahma followed by descriptions of eight kings. It contains 343 verses.

Rudra Avtar: Deals with the two incarnations of Indra, namely as Datta Avtar and Paras Nath Avtar.

Shabad Patshashi Dasvee: This is a collection of ten hymns (Shabads, also called Shabad Hazare). They are for singing in the classical raga indicated for each Shabad. They deal with the futility of asceticism, idolatry and attachment. One hymn in the *Khayal* tells us of the Guru's condition after escape from Chamkaur to the Machhiwara jungle. In this, Guru declares his faith in the essentiality of God, to care for the Children.

Sri Mukh Vak Swayyas: These are 32 quatrains on God and current religious practices. The Guru rejects the ritual and hypocrisy of all priestly classes.

Khalsa Mehma: These are verses in praise of the Khalsa brotherhood.

Pakhyan Charitra or Charito-pakhyan: These are 404 stories in verse, illustrating the noble and wicked sides of life. Some deal with bad women, some with their virtue and valour. The total number of verses is 7558.

Sri Shastra Nam Mala: This is a list of armaments, and deeds of those who used them well. The names of the weapons are spelt in the form of riddles.

Zafar-Nama: It is actually the reply of Guru Gobind Singh to Aurangzeb's letter to the Guru to meet him at the Moghul Court. It is written in Persian verse and in two parts, the first being an invocation to God to seek His blessing, and the second, the actual reply to Aurangzeb. The Guru gives a fair criticism of the emperor, mentioning both his good and bad qualities. The Guru emphasised the moral law that all who are hypocritical and violent will eventually get their just punishment, for the wheel of providence grinds slowly and exceedingly small.

Hikayat: These are eleven stories in Persian verse, each with a moral lesson. Some of the stories are the same as in Pakhyan Charitra. These stories begin with the praise of God.

The Dasam Granth was primarily compiled to awaken heroic sentiments among the Sikhs so as to enable them to fight against political injustice and religious intolerance. The influence of Hindu theology, history, mythology, philosophy and literature on Guru Gobind Singh is quite evident. The book also serves as a reference work on all classical allusions found in the Adi Granth. It has therefore an important place in Sikh literature and theology.

The compositions of the Dasam Granth may be divided into two main categories :

- (i) Devotional Poetry: like Jaap, Akal Ustat, Benati Chaupai, Shabad Hazare, etc.
- (ii) Heroic Poetry: like Chaubis Avtar, Bachitra Natak, Chandi-di-Var.etc.

Devotional Poetry: Apart from the praises of God which include more than a hundred positive attributes of Him in the Jaap, the Guru dwells on the negative and destructive aspects of God. Weaponry or warfare is the way in which He punishes the wicked and the unjust. The Martial God is All-steel, the Holder of the Sword, the User of the Bow and the Arrow. The Guru emphasises too the efficacy of the Holy Name. He says:

"Repeat God's Name, establish God's Name in your heart:

Do obeisance to the Lord and repeat His Name."

As a saint-soldier, Guru Gobind Singh declared his mission in the following words:

"I assumed birth for the purpose of spreading the Faith, Protecting the saints and extirpating all tyrants."

"When all peaceful methods fail,

It is righteous to draw the sword. "

"Knowing me to be His slave, God has aided me.

He has taken me by His hand and saved me."

In Chandi-di-Var, the Guru has emphasised the role of the sword wielded by Rama, Krishna and Durga, for the defeat of evil forces.

In Krishan Avtar, Guru Gobind Singh has expressly, mentioned the objective of his poetry thus: "I have rendered in the Tenth Chapter of the Bhagwat, with no other purpose than to arouse desire and zeal for waging a holy war, a righteous vindication of the Lord." The Guru wanted to acquaint the Sikhs with the Indian religious lore and to rouse their conscience against tyranny and injustice, as also to remove their sloth, frustration and cowardice.

Courage and Victory, are the Guru's watchwords. He says:

"Even if a low coward hears the ballad (of Chandi), he will be thrilled with the love of war and offer himself for fight in battle."

The Guru's praise of the sword is in fact his praise of God. Just as the sword subdues enemies, so does God defeat the wicked. In this sense, Sword is God, and God is Sword.

Music

The musical notes are at times martial, at times peaceful and soothing. We have both secular and sacred music in this Granth. The poet and the singer in the Tenth Guru join hands together to offer beautiful pictures and patterns in melody.

Diction

Guru Gobind Singh used Punjabi, Brij, Arabic and Persian words which suited the theme and the mood. Sanskrit words dominate the devotional compositions. Sometimes he used words from dialects like Dingal (Rajasthan) and Avadhi (Patna). As a conscientious artist in words, his semantic diversity is amazing. Onomatopoeic words and rhythmic syllables are found in plenty, as for instance, the cawing of the crows – *Kah Kah su Kookat Kan Kiyan*.

The importance of the Dasam Granth is three-fold. Firstly, it is a source of material on the life and work of Guru Gobind Singh, particularly the two autobiographical compositions—*Bachitra Natak* and *Zafar Nama*. Historians have drawn largely on these poems for their authenticity. *Secondly*, it is a treasury of lyrical poetry, portrait-painting, heroic and narrative poetry. *Thirdly*, it is a collection of literature in Brij Bhasha, Punjabi and Persian, belonging to the later medieval India. It also offers a glimpse into ancient Indian history, folklore and culture. It is a panorama

of thousands of years of Indian tradition and civilisation—the procession of princes and paupers, the learned and the ignorant passing on the stage in strange costumes, exhibiting the frailties and inhibitions of mortal man.

Guru Gobind Singh was a prolific poet. At Paonta Sahib, where most of his literary activity took place, he employed 52 poets who worked for him in creative writing and translation. Being occupied by his wars with the hill-chiefs, the Moghul emperor and local governors, he had no time to compile a book of his own compositions. Later, when some one suggested that he include some of his own hymns in the Adi Granth, he rejected the suggestion, saying that his compositions were not his serious work, that he was merely experimenting with poetry and music, this humility being responsible for the non-incorporation of his hymns in that Scripture.

Mata Sundri, the widow of Guru Gobind Singh once asked Bhai Mani Singh to compile a volume of the Guru's poetry. She handed over to him all the copies she possessed of his poems. Bhai Mani Singh also collected copies from others. Bhai Mani Singh, who was a relative and had been a close companion of the Guru, spent many years sifting the materials and finally compiled a volume known as The Granth of the Tenth Master or the "Dasam Granth", in 1721.

The Dasam Granth embodies the philosophy and mission of Guru Gobind Singh. The Guru's philosophy has both positive and negative aspects. On the positive side, it declares the supremacy of God and His moral law. He uses, the power of the sword against the negative forces, of tyranny, violence and bigotry. His heroic poetry is meant to inspire, not to entertain. It is a poetry of higher ethics, aesthetically fulfilling and spiritually gratifying. Above all, it gives a clear picture of the real world, without any gloss or blackening. In the opening scene of Hussaini Jung (1695), his words are like the blows of a hammer:

"Goaded by the tumultuous booming of drums,

The doughty warriors gave a thunderous roar.

They jumped and leapt with their zeal afire and all intent.

As they plied their weapons with great excitement, inflicting grievous wounds." (Bachitra Natak)

On the other hand, the Guru's caustic criticism of meaningless ritual, greed and hypocrisy of so-called holy men; is vivid and compelling.

There is both imagery and resonance – an aesthetic vibration, which goes far beyond the literal meaning of words.

The heroic strain—*Bir rasa* - end in the tranquility of the *Shant rasa* (feeling of peace). The Guru's insight into the psychology of lovers in the portrayal of Radha's mind bypasses the traditional erotic detail. "Man's nature has an exterior world and also an interior world that lies within him. With his outer or conscious personality, man deals with the empirical world, with his inner personality, he struggles with the problems of his own individuality; few men know more than a few fragments of their inner world which is the unconscious, or of lying in the darkness of unknowing. The unconscious part of human nature is the source and origin of the conscious, of all created things and manifestations, even of creation."

Guru Gobind Singh was a fine singer and musicologist. He used new ragas like *Adana*, *Kafi* and *Paraj*, which were not included in the Adi Granth. His use of *Khayal* was also an addition to Sikh Sacred Music. The Guru patronised musicians. Buddhu and Saddu who were *rababis* sang the Asa-di-var in his court. He used poetry for both secular and spiritual purposes. His heroic poetry was intended to end the traditional concept of non-violence – *Ahimsa* – then forced on people by both king and priest. Now the voice of conscience should inspire people to fight for freedom and justice. His devotional poetry was intended to inspire the people for spiritual attainment. One writer has remarked:

"He gave us musical form that was martial and hymnal, sacred and secular, simple and complex. In him, we find a saint singing spiritual songs, a soldier listening to martial music, a householder singing of the virtue, of leading good life and of a painter creating wonderful sound pictures in music."

Finally, as the bulk of Guru Gobind Singh's poetry in the Dasam Granth is in Brij-bhasha, he is considered as a great poet not only in Hindi literature but also for his achievements in Punjabi and Persian poetry.

SECTION V
